Well it was only a matter of time before we contracted a positive case in South Harrison.

"Mayor,

You have your first official positive COVID case:

As of Saturday morning, April 4, 2020, Gloucester County has conducted 1,475 tests. Of those tests 1,197 are negatives, 251 are positives and 27 are still pending. Gloucester County's total positive COVID-19 cases is 251. The 220th case is a 40-year-old male from South Harrison."

The weather is nice and most are eager to do yard work and getting stir crazy from being stuck at home. Even though home improvement stores, garden centers etc., are open and considered essential the potential for contracting and spreading this virus is very real.

It's now being recommended to wear a scarf, bandanna, or mask in public places like grocery stores. Practice common sense and limit venturing out unless absolutely necessary.

Many are out of work, unemployment is skyrocketing and small businesses are struggling due to this shutdown. The more diligent we are now the sooner we can get back to work.
